DIRECTIONS TO THE RAMADA

Traveling from NORTH – I-77S/I-79 to I-64 West to Huntington, go 4 miles to Exit 56 – Montrose Drive: go Right at light and get into extreme Right lane – bear Right again, to the RAMADA on B Street

Traveling from SOUTH – I-77N to I-64W, go 3 miles to Exit 56 – Montrose Drive; go Right at light and get into extreme Right lane – bear Right again, following cloverleaf to 2nd Avenue – straight one block to the RAMADA on B Street

Traveling from EAST – I-63W to Huntington, take Exit 56 – Montrose Drive; go Right at light and get into extreme Right lane – bear Right again, following cloverleaf to 2nd Avenue – straight one block to the RAMADA on B Street
